

## **Technical Sheet**

Château Haut Grignon belongs to Bruno Segond, who also owns Château Lousteauneuf a little Cru Bourgeois widely distributed in Europe, Japan and Canada.

Appellation: Haut Grignon is located in the Medoc region and benefits from this appellation

Surface area: 4 hectares of vines

Soil and subsoil: composed of clay and gravel (representative from the region)

Grape Varieties: Carbernet Sauvignon 67% - Merlot 31% - Petit Verdot 2%

Average age of the vines: 25 years old

Density: 5000 vine stocks / hectare

Yield: 45 hectoliters / hectare which is rather low for the region

The vines: implementation of sustainable agriculture in the vineyard

Vinification: in stainless steel vats to enhance the fruit and freshness

Ageing: 60% in vats and 40% in French barrels

**Production:** 30 000 bottles

## **Tasting notes:**

Nice bouquet of black fruit and cedar. The palate is medium-bodied with firm tannins and a touch of spice. This is a fine wine that is drinkable in its youth and could age well.
